

Centro Tyrone Guzman: Positioning families for success

Toward a more thriving, forward-thinking Latinx community, Centro created—and tailored—curriculum grounded in family advocacy, access and agency. And from each workshop stemmed a call to action—speaking up at district budget meetings, joining its Latino Parent Advisory Council or testifying at the Capitol.

Keeping families and their motivations central, Centro’s well-attended workshops leave parents engaged and ready for more. Of the 62 participants:

- 100% reported feeling more empowered to advocate
- 90% “began or intend to begin” advocating within a school or system
- 100% helped design a gubernatorial forum that three candidates attended
